It is a pioneering institution committed to the cause of women empowerment through academic excellence and formation of character. The college was affiliated to Madurai Kamaraj University, Madurai up to September 2002 and presently to Mother Teresa Women's University, Kodaikanal since October 2002. The college was granted autonomy in 2004 which gives the more academic freedom to the Institution to frame the curricula to cater to the needs of the students. Curricular revisions are carried out by identifying the local diverse needs. Outcome Based Education with POs, PSOs and COs have been initiated and displayed on Institutional Website. More skill-based programs/courses may be introduced to achieve the growth in the employment part. The college has developed the **Curriculum by giving importance to the Gender, Environment and Sustainability, Human Values and Professional Ethics. Courses on Feminism in Tamil Literature, Feminist writing, Women's Writing, Women Studies, Women in India's Freedom Struggle, Women Entrepreneurship are some to be highlighted. Curriculum is integrated with cross cutting issues through Value Added Education**

Learning Levels of the students are being assessed through Class Tests, CIAs etc. Bridge courses are introduced for the fresher. Issuance of hands-on-project material, conduction of familiarization workshops, various quiz/presentation competitions are being arranged for the slow/advanced learners. Several participative learning methodologies are adopted by the institution such as group discussions, group projects, panel discussions etc. More emphasis on research component can be given to create the awareness about the research & innovation. Academic Calendar and teaching plans are well-mapped and found displayed on the institutional website. IT integration and CIAs are well-adopted in the examination procedures. Issuance of hall tickets, declaration of results is being made online. Programme outcomes, Programme specific outcomes and course outcomes for all programs offered and evaluated by the institution are stated and displayed on the website. Entrepreneur Development Cell (EDC), Central Instrumentation Center are the assets. Good number of the awards for innovation; several designs for market viable products are ready-to-form; 09 startups have been incubated so far. More emphasis can be given to patent filing, revenue generation through consultancies, corporate trainings, tapping of funds from CSRs activities through Industry-Institution Linkages. Extension activities were conducted during last five years; 07 villages are adopted, and various activities were planned under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, Swachcha Bharat Abhiyan. Awareness programs and rally are being organized on literacy, tree plantation, health and hygiene, communal harmony, processing and value addition of products, free medical camps, solid waste management, avoiding the use of plastics and self-employment</p>

Also, stay facility; safety and security found are adequate. Indoor and Outdoor sports / games facilities are remarkable. 100 bedded sports hostels are an added advantage in the physical facilities. Library is fully automated using ILMS “Nirmals”. Library has good number of rare books including Books published before the year 1950’s, Bounded Journals / Magazines from the year 1978, Encyclopedias, Question papers and College Magazines. The IT facilities including Wi-Fi is well-versed. Adequate number of computers along with the bandwidth of the Internet Connectivity. Maintenance and utilization of the physical facilities governed by the Secretary under supervision of Heads of the Departments.
