

PAINTED MYTHS (Face Painting)

- Individual event
- Duration: 60 minutes
- Theme: African folklore, myths, masks, or symbolic figures
- Participants must bring their own materials
- Only face painting is permitted; no additional body painting
- Time: 11.30 a.m. - 12.30 p.m.



PATCHWORK AFRICA (Collage Making)

- Individual event
- Duration: 60 minutes
- Theme: African literature, folklore, community life, women in African myths, Nature, animals and ecological wisdom in folklore.
- Materials shall be brought by the participants
- Use of mobile phones or digital references is not allowed during the event
- Time: 11.30 a.m. - 12.30 p.m.

WORD DRUMS (Poetry Writing)

- Individual event
- Duration: 60 minutes
- Poems must be original and written on the spot
- Topic will be given on the spot based on the theme of the intercollegiate meet.
- Poems should be written in English
- Time: 11.30 a.m. - 12.30 p.m.

INKED AFRICA (Drawing)

- Individual event
- Duration: 60 minutes
- Theme: Symbols, myths, or narratives from African folklore or literature
- Medium: Pencil, crayons, or colours (participants must bring materials)
- Use of reference materials is not permitted
- Time: 11.30 a.m. - 12.30 p.m.

MYTHSCAPES (Book Review)

- Individual event
- Duration: 5 minutes
- Participants shall present a critical review of an African literary text or folklore-based work
- Emphasis should be on theme, interpretation, and relevance
- Notes may be used, but reading directly from the text is discouraged
- Time: 11.30 a.m. - 12.30 p.m.

INTERPRETIVE FRAMES (Paper Presentation)

- Duration: 5 minutes for presentation and 2 minutes for interaction
- PowerPoint presentation may be used
- Theme: Participants shall present an original paper on African literature, folklore, oral tradition or myth focusing on interpretation, theory or cultural context
- Time: 11.00 - 11.45 a.m.

ROOTS AND RIDDLES (Quiz)

- Team event (2 members per team)
- The quiz will consist of three rounds based on African literature, authors, folklore, myths, and symbols (MCQ, Visuals & Rapid Fire)
- Quizmaster's decision shall be final
- Prelims will be held at 10.30 a.m.
- Time: 11.45 a.m.-12.30 p.m.



WALK THE TALE (Literary Parade)

- Team event (1-4 participants)
- Duration: 30-45 seconds per participant
- Participants may embody African folk characters, storytellers, animals or mythic figures, accompanied by a short narration
- Costumes and props are encouraged
- Time: 1.30 - 2.00 p.m.

BEATS OF AFRICA (African Dance with Properties)

- Team event (maximum 6 participants)
- Duration: 4 - 5 minutes
- Performance must reflect African dance forms or folk traditions
- Use of properties is mandatory. Properties may include traditional drums, masks, sticks, scarves, gourds, shields or symbolic folk artefacts (non-hazardous only).
- Pre-recorded music may be used and must be submitted in advance
- Time: 2.00 - 2.30 pm

General Instructions:

- All events should be based on the theme of the intercollegiate meet.
- Registration fee per participant is Rs. 150/-
- Registration fee includes working lunch, refreshments and certificates.
- Participants should bring their college ID Card.
- Soft copies of music or such requirements should be brought in pendrive.
