Report – 24.06.2025

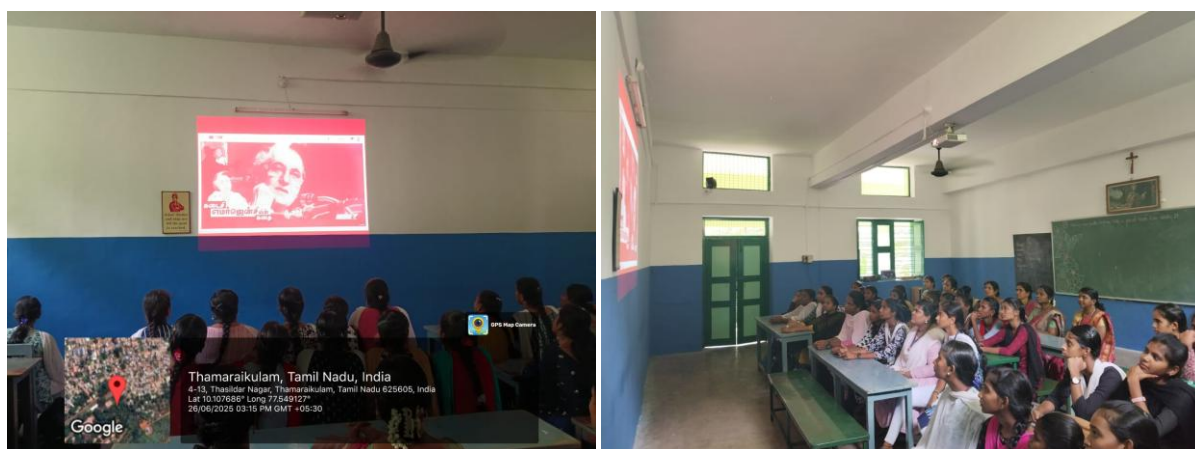
