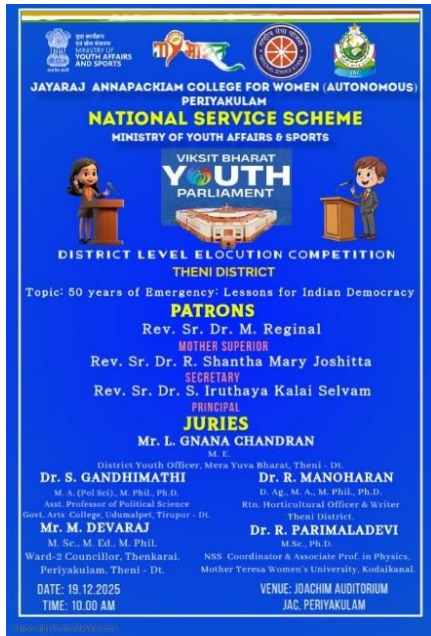


DECEMBER
