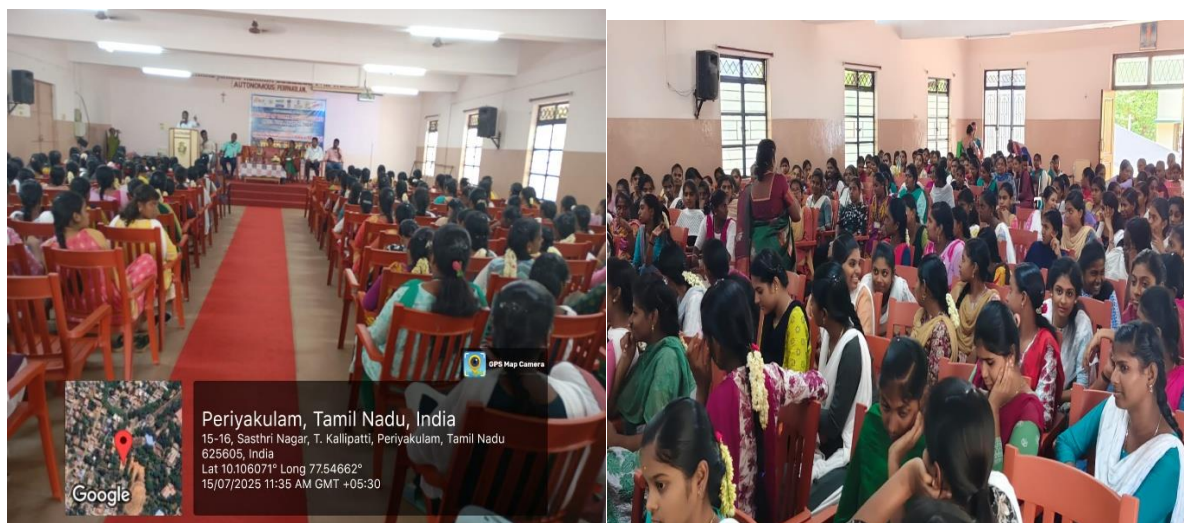
In connection with the 50th Anniversary of the Observance of the Emergency, JACSAFA in collaboration with PG & Research Centre of History and, screened the

Documentary movie on *Emergency Declaration* on 26th June 2025 at 3:00 p.m. in Room No. 1. The event aimed to provide students with a deeper understanding of the historical context, political developments and social impact of the Emergency period which declared in India during the regime of Former Prime Minister Mrs. Indira Gandhi. The documentary highlighted key events, major policy changes, restrictions on civil liberties and the resistance movements that emerged in 1975. 65 students were actively participated and benefited.

Santhanam, SJ, who spoke on *Fundamental Rights and Directive Principles of the Constitution*. He emphasized their importance in ensuring equality, individual freedoms, and social welfare.

The sessions were marked by active discussions where participants shared perspectives and explored solutions to contemporary constitutional challenges. The **valedictory address** was delivered by Rev. Fr. Dr. A. Cyril, SJ, who summarized the key insights and encouraged the participants to practice constitutional values in daily life.

A total of **220 participants** benefited from the conference, gaining valuable knowledge of the Indian Constitution and its relevance today. The event concluded with the National Anthem.
