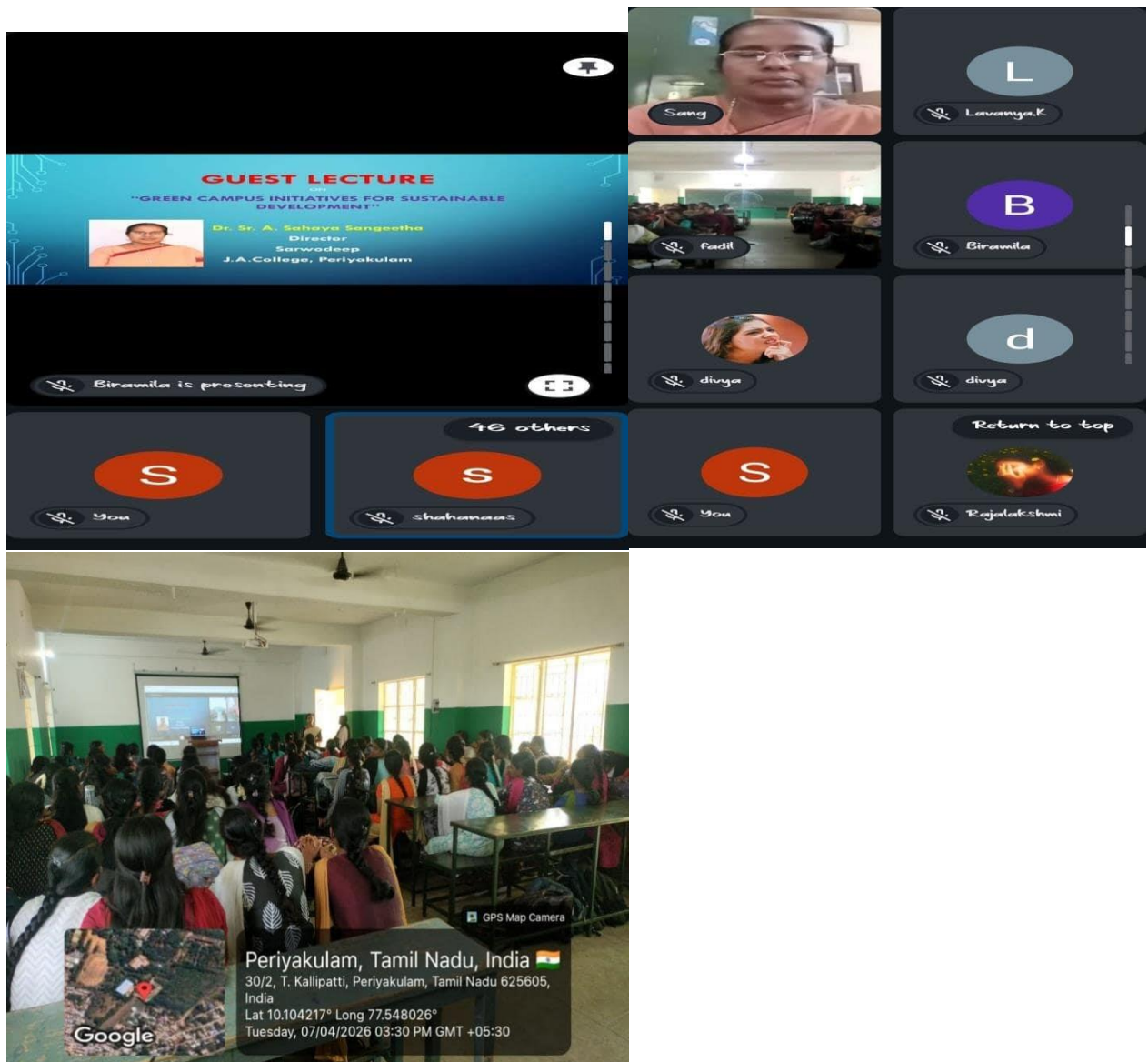
The programme commenced with a welcome address by the faculty member, who highlighted the need for sustainable development and the role of students in maintaining a green and healthy environment.
